*To date, the CDFS program has graduated 152 students, thirty-seven or 24% of whom are either enrolled in or have completed their master's degrees, and one enrolled in a Ph.D. program. Note: This number reflects only those students who reported being enrolled in graduate schools. There may be additional students who have not informed the Unit of completion of their graduate programs or who are about to complete, and therefore, did not report. Also, some students may have postponed their enrollment into graduate school due to the uncertainty with the COVID-19 Pandemic.
