

Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) will host two (3) years Health Disparities training for undergraduate students. The work titled 'Expanding Curricula, Training and Outreach of Southern University at New Orleans Biology/Forensic Science, Nursing and Pre-med Undergraduate Students Under COVID-19 Response Health Equity Strategy with the LA Health Department' focused on increasing awareness and preparedness on COVID-19 disease health disparities among populations at high-risk and underserved, including racial and ethnic minority populations and rural Communities by training SUNO students funded by LA Dept. of Health/State of Louisiana and mandates activities in the following areas:

- 1. Clinicians training/internship/mentoring/supervision for prospective Students in Medicine, Allied Health, Nursing, Dental, Pharmacy, Postgraduate Biomedical sciences:
- Vaccinations, Vaccine Acceptance or reduce Vaccine hesitancy to prevent COVID-19 infection and spread in the SUNO Community, Surrounding Communities, Greater New Orleans and Elsewhere.

The grant is running from July 01 2021 to May 31 2024 from SUNO's Park Campus. Students will be engaged in additional activities; Develop Infectious Disease, Disability/braille Accommodation curricula, provide skills training in collection, chain of custody, identify COVID-19 viral DNA sequences isolated from groups in communities and within our University to estimate their occurrence and frequency among others.

Students will be paid approximately \$4,000 per summer equivalent full work per semester cycle upon completing their allocated Health Disparities project. Students will need to sign a contract form on the first day of the work activities.
