

Application Procedure

This program provides educational and professional opportunities for undergraduate and graduate students, and K-12 educators.

- 1. Complete the Robert Noyce Scholarship/Stipend Application
- 2. Provide an unofficial copy of your transcript
- 3. Provide two letters of recommendations
- 4. Write a 250-word essay/personal statement describing your educational and career goals
- 5. Include a copy of your current résumé
- 6. Submit a copy of your government identification

Selection Criteria

To apply for the Robert Noyce grant, you must meet the following requirements:

- Enrolled at Southern University at New Orleans
- U.S. Citizenship or a Permanent Resident
- Undergraduate STEM major (at least a Junior) or post-baccalaureate STEM majors or STEM Professional
- Minimum GPA 2.8
- Pass Praxis I/ACT 22 or higher
- Pass Praxis II (content) for post-baccalaureate

You must also:

- Pursue a major in STEM (Biology or Mathematics) that will serve as a specialized teacher in grades 9 through 12.
- Teach a minimum of two years in a "high-need" school in the Jefferson Parish Public School System (JPPSS) for each year of scholarship/ stipend support.
- If Robert Noyce Scholars do not complete the program, they are obligated to refund the scholarships in full back to the program.
