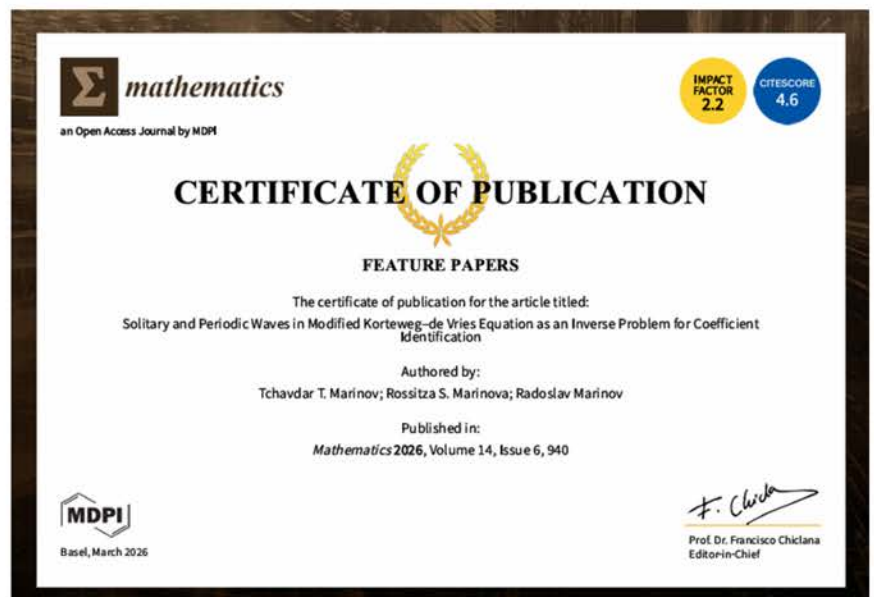
Community Mentorship
