The workshop module addresses: (1) classroom environment; (2) classroom management; (3) instructional design; and (4) instructional delivery. The text for the 4 week module will be The Teacher's Craft by Paul Chance. College faculty and practicing teachers in K-5th grade will provide instruction. There will be opportunities for the alternative certification candidates to observe in classrooms.
