The program of study includes 80 hours of contact readiness training incorporated in a 4-week workshop module to be completed upon enrollment in the program, to be offered three times during an academic year. This timeframe for the offering of the workshop module allows a candidate to begin the program in any semester. The workshop module addresses: (1) classroom environment; (2) classroom management; (3) instructional design; and (4) instructional delivery. The text for the 4 week module will be The Teacher's Craft by Paul Chance. College faculty and practicing teachers in K-5th grade will provide instruction. There will be opportunities for the alternative certification candidates to observe in classrooms. The module will be monitored by sign-in sheets, participation in discussions, completion of assignments and classroom observations.
