

Repeating A Class Policy

The regulatory definition for full-time enrollment status in Federal Handbook states to allow a student to retake (one time only per previously passed course), any previously passed course. Which means, a course passed means any grade higher than an “F,” regardless of any school or program policy requiring a higher qualitative grade or measure to have been considered to have passed the course. This retaken class may be counted towards a student’s enrollment status and the student may be awarded Title IV aid for the enrollment status based on inclusion of the class. If a student retakes a course more than once, then he or she may not be eligible for Federal Aid for the retaken course.

Satisfactory Academic Progress & Repeated Coursework

For satisfactory academic progress purposes, each time a course is taken counts as an attempt; but only the **first time** a passing grade is received is it counted as completion.
