Dear Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) Community:

The University continues its steadfast commitment to providing a safe environment for all faculty, staff and students. By continuing to follow all Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines during the COVID-19 pandemic, we aim to facilitate and practice safety precautions. Additionally, the Southern University System (SUS) instituted vaccine protocols for the upcoming Spring 2022 semester for all campuses. Many of you have already submitted your vaccination card; however, I must ask you to submit your card via Med+Proctor to ensure we are in line with the SUS protocols and dashboard.

As stated in Dr. Belton's November 19, 2021 letter, "all students and employees will be required to follow the vaccine protocols. For students, this means providing proof of vaccination, submitting a medical exemption or religious exemption or submitting a letter of dissent. For employees, this means providing proof of vaccination or submitting a medical or religious exemption. For those students and employees with approved exemption or dissent, regular COVID-19 testing is required to be on campus."

In other words, if you are not vaccinated, you will be required to test weekly. Testing will take place weekly at the University Center: Monday between the hours of 8:00 - 10:30 a.m., Tuesday from 11:00 a.m. -1:00 p.m., and Monday evening between the hours of 5:00 - 7:00 pm.
